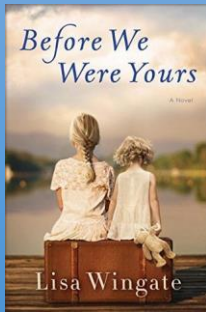

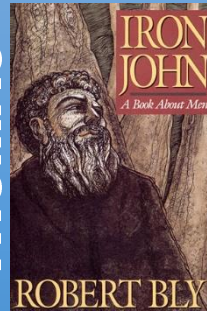
**The Golden Age**

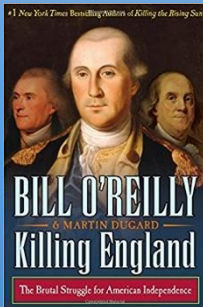
**Tell the Wolves I'm Home**

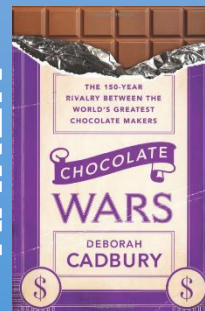
**Turtles All the Way Down**
